A big thank you to everyone who is helping to provide this much needed service during these difficult times.

Our mini **Food Bank** is growing by the day thanks to the generosity of our residents and a large donation from Chalford Hill School. If you are feeling the pinch and really don't know how you will be able to afford essentials this week or month, please come into the Parish Centre and help yourself. In addition, we have '**Barry**', our **Freezer of Love**, stocked with nutritious meals made by the Long Table.

In addition (if the above is not enough), Thomas Keble students are working with us again this year to provide small Christmas gifts for those residents who would enjoy a little treat at Christmas.

Trees – safety work will be carried out by our Arborculturist in Frith Wood in early January. This will entail the removal of dead wood over or close to footpaths, broken hanging branches and the cleaning up of multiple broken limbs and branch stubs damaged during contractor felling. There is an ongoing problem with squirrel damage that leads to the regular dropping of branches. No trees will be felled.

Chalford Band Hut track – we are liaising with the band on improvements to the track leading up to the band hut. It is anticipated that both the band and the Parish Council will provide resources for the improvement. Our congratulations to the band for taking trophies for the highest placed 1st Section Band and 2nd place overall in the recent Southwest Brass Band Association Competition.

We have given permission for **ChalCAN Biodiversity** to plant three rowan trees and sow wild flower seed on the land at the rear of Tesco loading bay. We look forward to seeing a beautiful display next year.

Footpath Volunteers getting better at walling



Those readers who walk regularly along the path from Coppice Hill into Dimmel's Dale will have seen the work the Footpath Volunteers have been doing since June repairing the church wall. After a couple of false starts (our work fell down - twice!) we've been taken in hand by the Parish's resident dry stone walling expert Janet Gaskell. Janet has both visited the site to inspect our work, and commented on the weekly photographs we send her. As a result we've made sure we've got solid wide foundations, are using big stones at the bottom, are using a line to keep things parallel and straight, are taking care with the latter (making the wall slightly narrower as it

gets higher) and making sure we use through stones from front to back for strength. The latest comment from Janet was 'Excellent', plus some advice on the next steps. We think we're winning. Thanks Janet.
